


Comparatives and superlatives.

Comparatives and superlatives are used to describe the difference between people or things.

Comparatives.

If an adjective has one syllable, we usually add -er to the adjective and than after the adjective.

For example,

If an adjective has two or more syllables, we usually use *more* + *adjective* + *than*.

For example,


Tony is handsome. He is **more handsome than** Phil.




Is Tony taller than Rashida?

Superlatives.

We use superlatives to compare three or more people or objects. They show which person or object is 'the most' of something.

If an adjective has one syllable, we use *the* and usually add *-est* to the adjective.

For example,

Gary is taller than Rashida and Aisha. Gary is the tallest. the + adjective + -est



If an adjective has two or more syllables, we usually use the + most + adjective. For example,

Tony is more handsome than Phil and Dennis. Tony is the most handsome.


